## Getting Started

Create an RBDigital Gateway account using your library card.

- If you already have a Zinio account, just login using the email and password you use for Zinio digital magazines.
- Otherwise, go to the library's RBDigital Gateway page at:

- Click on the **Create New Account** link in the top right corner of the screen.
- Enter your **Library card number** and click **Next**.
- Finish creating your account by filling in the **requested fields**.

## CLASSIC MOVIES

**The Cabinet of Dr. Caligari** (1920; Foreign)  
Dr. Caligari's somnambulist, Cesare, and his deadly predictions.

**Nosferatu** (1922; Foreign)  
Vampire Count Orlok expresses interest in a new residence and real estate agent Hutter's wife. Silent classic based on the story "Dracula."

**M** (1931; Foreign)  
When the police in a German city are unable to catch a child-murderer, other criminals join in the manhunt.

**The Invisible Man** (1933; Starring Claude Rains)  
A scientist finds a way of becoming invisible, but in doing so, he becomes murderously insane.

**The Third Man** (1949; Starring Orson Welles)  
Pulp novelist Holly Martins travels to shadowy, post-war Vienna, only to find himself investigating the mysterious death of an old friend, black-market opportunist Harry Lime.

**The Kid** (1921; Directed by Charles Chaplin)  
The Tramp cares for an abandoned child, but events put that relationship in jeopardy.

**Duck Soup** (1933; Starring the Marx brothers)  
Rufus T. Firefly is named president/dictator of bankrupt Freedonia and declares war on neighboring Sylvania over the love of wealthy Mrs. Teasdale.

**Secret Agent** (1936; Directed by Alfred Hitchcock)  
After three British agents are assigned to assassinate a mysterious German spy during World War I, two of them become ambivalent when their duty to the mission conflicts with their consciences.

**Dial M for Murder** (1954; Directed by A. Hitchcock)  
An ex-tennis pro carries out a plot to murder his wife. When things go wrong, he improvises a brilliant plan B.

**Psycho** (1960; Directed by Alfred Hitchcock)  
A Phoenix secretary steals \$40,000 from her employer's client, goes on the run and checks into a remote motel run by a young man under the domination of his mother.

**The Hustler** (1961; Starring Paul Newman & Jackie Gleason)  
An up-and-coming pool player plays a long-time champion in a single high-stakes match.

## DOCUMENTARIES

**Bean to Bar: A Film About Artisan Chocolate** (2013)  
This film focuses on the artisan chocolate makers renaissance in the United States

**Between the Folds** (2008)  
Depicts a cast of fine artists and eccentric scientists (from MIT and NASA) who have devoted their lives to the unlikely medium of modern origami.

**If a Tree Falls** (2011)  
A rare behind-the-curtain look at the Earth Liberation Front, the radical environmental group that the FBI calls America's 'number one domestic terrorist threat.'

**Assault on El Capitan** (2013)  
Documentary about Ammon McNeely's legendary climb.

**Barkley 100** (2014)  
This documentary tells the story of one of the world's most difficult and bizarre sporting events: The Barkley Marathons. This 100-mile footrace and its 60-hour time limit force athletes to run, crawl and climb an elevation gain equivalent to two treks up Mt. Everest.

**Last Shop Standing** (2012)  
Inspired by the book of the same name, by Graham Jones, takes you behind the counter to discover why nearly 2000 record shops have already disappeared across the UK.

## PBS

**The Botany of Desire** (2009; Starring Michael Pollan)  
A documentary on the evolutionary relationship between humans and plants.

**Ken Burns: The Address** (2014)  
The story of a tiny school in Putney, Vermont, the Greenwood School, where each year the students are encouraged to memorize, practice and recite the Gettysburg Address.

**Art & Copy** (2010)  
A powerful film about advertising and inspiration.

**Jake Shimabukuro: Life on Four Strings** (2013)  
Follow ukulele virtuoso Jake Shimabukuro over the course of a musical season.

**The Ghost Army** (2013)  
The Ghost Army was a United States Army tactical deception unit during World War II officially known as the 23rd Headquarters Special Troops.
