Recently a great deal of research into brain-based gender differences in learning has emerged. The assumption that co-educational environments are the best environments for all children in all grades is coming into question in light of this emerging research and the declining level of academic and co-curricular achievement of males nationwide. Books such as Boys and Girls Learn Differently by Michael Gurian, and Why Gender Matters by Leonard Sax, present new research findings in the field of gender-based brain development that support gender-based approaches towards educating children. Mr. Kalkus will share some of the more compelling findings from this research and their implication for educating children in the twenty-first century.
